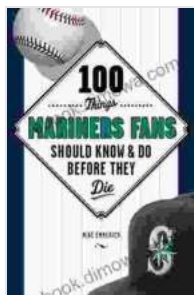

Mariners memorabilia is a great way to show your team spirit. You can find Mariners hats, jerseys, and other items at the team store at T-Mobile Park or online.

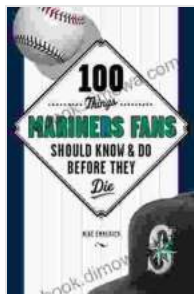
9. Join a Mariners fan club

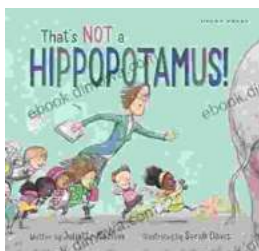

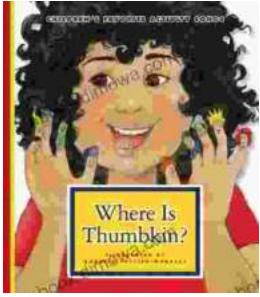
