Simone concludes by arguing that we need to fight for a new era of privacy and freedom. She calls for an end to mass surveillance, and for the creation of new laws to protect our privacy.

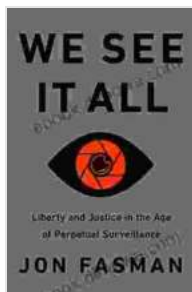

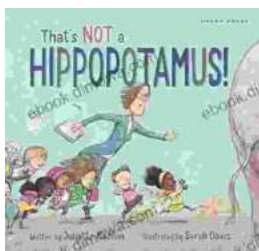
